


Friendships were not simply relationships between individuals but were supported by the understanding of the nature of Christian vocation.

The Christian contemplative world produced a good number of surprising relationships between men and women and gave to women, because if its vision of the human person, a place of freedom to develop in personal ways and be transfigured. These friendships proclaim the advent of a new world in which barriers drawn between the sexes could no longer impede the intense and deeply Christian impulse to love one another and to become as one person in the profoundly human task of recreating life in the image of God. p31

Jerome d 420 was followed from Rome to Holy Land by a band of female ascetics, who wanted to live the Christian monastic vision.


- Paula a noble widow and daughter Eustochium found monastic communities for men and women in Bethlehem
- The friendship these two shared was central to the great churchman's entires life's vision, but suffered disapproval for relationship with the opposite sex.

Another Roman widow, Melania the Elder established a double monastery with her associate Rufinus.

Melania's granddaughter, Melania the Younger with her husband Pinion took a vow of chastity, and founded two monasteries at Tagaste and later joined Jerome's communities in Bethlehem.

John Chrysostom d407 and Olympias

- the bishop enjoyed a relationship of mutual respect and moral support, she received spiritual direction and edification, he received emotional support from her when he was in exile
- she provided financial support and supervision for a convent in Constantinople which he established yet Chrysostom was publicly censored for meeting her alone.



8th cent Anglo-Saxon the nun Lioba travelled to Germany with

St Boniface to establish the Christian religion



- -a soul mate and his intellectual equal, a classical scholar
- -founded a woman's community
- -he granted her permission to pray at his monastery of Fulda, a favour never granted to any other woman.
- -Boniface requested that she be buried beside him "so that they who had served God in this lifetime with equal sincerity and zeal should await together the day of resurrection. (monks did not carry this out)

Medieval Era Francis d 1226 and Clare of Assisi d1253


-both left their noble families to live in prayer and poverty

Clare was established by Francis as the foundress of the second order of the Franciscan family. She shared Francis' intimate vision in a way no one else did. While she remained in the cloister and Francis and his brothers were mendicants, they were in constant contact and considered their work one.

Franciscan path to friendship with God

- -a wholehearted relationship with God
- -relationship as a way of life, not just a point of meditation
- -God in the person of Jesus Christ
- -prayer fosters our fidelity to a relationship with Christ
- -the deeper we enter into friendship with Christ, the more willing we are to love our neighbour




Christ left us an example that we might follow in his footprints. St Francis

Medieval Era

Jordan of Saxony, successor of Dominican order after Dominic

-Diana of Andalo, young woman with a passion for contemplative life against family wishes. Jordan helped her establish the second order of St Dominic and wrote (in letters between 1222-1237)

You are so deeply engraved on my heart that then more I realise how truly you love me from the depths of your soul, the more incapable I am of forgetting you and the more constantly you are in my thoughts, for your love of me moves me profoundly and makes my love for you burn more strongly.

Catherine of Siena d 1380 and Raymond of Capua

- -her spiritual director for 6 years and treasured friend
- -referred to him as the father and son given me by that gentle Mother Mary (dual relational role evocative of the specific nature of rel)
- -After her death Raymond devoted 11 years of his life to recording her memory, one of most reliable sources of her life.

Catherine of Genoa d 1510 & Ettore Vernazzo, young lawyer 23 yrs younger

- she was matron of a hospital, attracted followers by visionary and penitential gifts
- met during an outbreak of plague, he offered himself as an aide wanting to live a holy life
- close friendship extended to his wife and daughters
- her historian and compiled her life and doctrine

Vincent de Paul d 1660 and Louise de Marillac d 1660

- long and faithful friendship, peasant turned priest, illegitimate daughter of French aristocracy
- together founded the Daughters of Charity, giving expression to their mutual passion for charity and ministry to the sick and dying.
- Vincent was originally her director
- recognised her mature spiritual gifts and gave her much freedom in the direction of their congregation
- he gave her his blessing to conduct retreats for her spiritual charges



Tell us please what is on your mind? Mine has been very much occupied this morning with you and with the thoughts Our Lord is giving you. Vincent to Louise 1630

As for the rest, I beg you once and for all, not to give it a thought until our Lord makes it evident that He wishes it, and at present He is giving indications to the contrary. We want a number of good things with a desire that seems to be of God, and yet it is not always from Him... You are trying to become the servant of these poor women, and God wants you to be His own, and perhaps of more people that you would be in that way. And even if you were only His, is it not enough... that your heart is honouring the tranquility of Our Lord's? Then it will be fit and ready to serve Him. Letter 71



Pierre de Berulle and Madame Acarie established a long-term relationship resulting in the importation of the Spanish Discalced Carmelites into France.

Jean Eudes, a missioner and member of the Oratory, an organisation dedicated to the spiritual nurturance of the priesthood instituted by Berulle, had a tender affection for Madame de Camilly who shared a zeal forces reforming work. She soon became the manager of and his right hand in the Order of Our Lady of Charity, which he founded for the care of fallen women. They held a veneration for Marie des Vallees, a flamboyant woman with mystical gifts. Marie became Eudes inspiration. He called her the eagle and under her influence his later life took a new direction.




