## 5. THE LINE CONTINUES RUTH 4:13-17

The birth of Obed

<sup>13</sup>So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When when he went in to her, YHWH made her conceive, and she bore a son. 'Went in to her' (verse 13) denotes sexual intercourse.

<sup>14</sup>Then the women said to Naomi, "Blessed be YHWH, who has not left you this day without a redeemer. May his name be celebrated in Israel! <sup>15</sup>He shall be to you a restorer of life and sustain you in your old age; for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him." The name that the women want celebrated in Israel is YHWH, but also the new-born son.

The birth of a son has returned life to Naomi. He is God's response to her complaint in 1:20-21.

<sup>16</sup>Then Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and delighted in caring for him.

Naomi delights in her grandson, who will turn out to be the grandfather of King David.

<sup>17</sup>The women of the neighborhood gave him a name, saying, "A son has been born to Naomi." They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David.
