


IJohn 1:1-3

We declare to you what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life — this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us. Holiness

'The holiness of the Church is constantly shown forth in the fruits of grace which the Spirit produces in the faithful. And so it must be.

It is expressed in many ways by those who, each in his or her own state of life, tend to the perfection of love'(Vatican II LG 39).

Communion with God is the most satisfying communion we can experience, for it is the communion for which we most long. In the famous words of Saint Augustine: 'You have made us for yourself, O God, and our hearts are restless till they rest in You'(Confessions I.I).

Jesus promised the Samaritan woman: 'The water that I will give will become in you a spring of water gushing up to eternal life'(John 4:14). On a later occasion he promised that rivers of life-giving water would flow from the heart of those who believed in him (see John 7:38-39). At the last supper we hear Jesus say: 'If you love me you will keep my word, and my Father will love you, and we will come to you and make our home with you'(John 14:23). He concludes with a prayer: 'As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us ... so that the love with which you loved me may be in them, and I in them'(John 17:21,26).

John of the Cross speaks of God dwelling in us and gracing us with his love. God says to each one 'I am yours and for you. I am delighted to be what I am so as to be yours and give myself to you'(Living Flame 3.6).

A journey to the heart


'Heed the counsel of your own heart, for no one is more faithful to you than it is. Your soul often forewarns you. It is better than seven watchmen in a tower' (Sirach 37:13).

He is not telling us to follow our heart blindly, for he adds: 'While you heed your heart, beg the Most High to guide you in the path of truth.'


Proverbs also stresses the importance of the human heart: 'More than all else, keep watch over your own heart, since there are the wellsprings of life'(Proverbs 4:23).

We are to listen humbly and attentively to others, listening for God's Word. But we must remember that God dwells within us and God respects our heart/soul. When God speaks his Word to us we will know, for the Spirit within will say Yes to what we hear. Heart will be speaking to heart.
