## Psalm 53

Prayer during the Day Tuesday Week 2

This is almost identical with Psalm 14. We refer the reader to that psalm for a commentary. The main difference is that here we find 'God' where Psalm 14 has YHWH. Other slight variations are indicated by the use of italics.

The title reads: 'To the leader: according to Mahalath. A Maskil\* of David'. Psalm 88 is the only other psalm that has 'according to Mahalath'. It may refer to the rhythm.

<sup>1</sup>Fools say in their hearts\*, 'There is no God.' They are corrupt, they perpetrate dreadful deeds; there is no one who does good.

<sup>2</sup>*God* looks down from heaven on Adam's descendants to see if there is a wise person anywhere, one who seeks after God.

<sup>3</sup>They have all gone astray, they are all depraved; there is no one who does good, no, not one.

<sup>4</sup>Those evildoers, do they know nothing, they who devour my people as if they were eating bread, and do not call upon *God*?

<sup>5</sup>Well then, they shall be in great terror\*,

in terror such as has not been. For God will scatter the bones of the ungodly; they will be put to shame, for God has rejected them.

At this point Psalm 14:5-6 reads:

Well then, they will have to tremble, for God stands with the just. You may thwart the plans of the poor, but YHWH is their refuge.

> <sup>6</sup>O that deliverance\* for Israel would come from Zion! When *God* restores the fortunes of his people, Jacob will rejoice; Israel will be glad.
